

#### Where to get health care

- You need an OHIP card to get health care at a hospital or medical clinic.
  - If you do not have an OHIP card, you may get health care at a community health centre. Refer to the list of community health centres (in binder).
- For information on how to obtain an OHIP card, call 1-866-532-3161.
- For help in finding a family doctor, call Health Care Connect at 1-800-445-1822.
- Ask your settlement worker for information on low-cost prescriptions.
- To get free confidential multilingual health advice from a registered nurse 24 hours a day, call Telehealth Ontario at 1-866-797-0000.
- Call 9-1-1 only if a person's life is in danger. For all other health needs, see your family doctor or go to a community health centre. Refer to the list of important phone numbers (in binder).
