The Applied Public Health Chair (APHC) Program, a joint initiative of the CIHR Institute of Population and Public Health (IPPH) and the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC), supports mid-career researchers to conduct research that addresses pressing public health challenges that is focused on actionable solutions and integrated with policy and decision-making to improve health and health equity. In leading this work, Chairs have reported the importance of, and challenges in, engaging in advocacy and championing evidence-informed policies and services that promote and protect population health and wellbeing. In this session, a panel of three Chairs and a senior decision-maker will share their perspectives, successes and challenges in advocating for policies and services based on their research findings on controversial, hot-button public health issues, such as harm reduction and the decriminalization of illicit drugs; public trust and vaccinations; (re)emerging infectious diseases and wastewater surveillance.

Priorités partagées en santé : mesurer les progrès et combler les lacunes en matière de données grâce aux indicateurs communs

Les systèmes de santé du Canada sont mis à rude épreuve et nécessitent des améliorations dans plusieurs domaines. Pour faire face aux défis actuels, les gouvernements fédéral, provinciaux et territoriaux unissent leurs efforts en vue d'améliorer les soins de santé et de créer des indicateurs communs permettant de mesurer les progrès réalisés dans les domaines prioritaires de nos systèmes de santé.

Mercredi 30 avril | 11 h à 12 h 30

Cette discussion permettra

- d'examiner l'approche sur les priorités partagées qui vise à mesurer les progrès, notamment dans la sélection, l'élaboration et la diffusion d'indicateurs;
- de décrire l'approche collaborative permettant de cibler les sources de données et de combler les lacunes en matière de données;
- de discuter de l'utilité de ce travail pour la population canadienne et les décideurs des systèmes de santé;

Publication d'indicateurs communs en vue d'améliorer les soins de santé des Canadiens

En octobre 2024, l'ICIS a publié les résultats de 12 nouveaux indicateurs communs liés aux priorités partagées en santé. Cette publication fournit des résultats et une mise en contexte pertinente pour les 12 indicateurs communs dans 4 domaines prioritaires des systèmes de santé :

- Soins de première ligne
- Main-d'œuvre de la santé et chirurgies
- Santé mentale et utilisation de substances
- Information électronique sur la santé

Les résultats sont présentés pour le Canada et les provinces et territoires, et ils comprennent la répartition selon les facteurs de stratification de l'équité lorsque les données le permettent.

- Primary health care
- Health workforce and surgeries
- Mental health and substance use
- Electronic health information

Results are presented for Canada and the provinces and territories, with equity breakdowns where available.
