Practicum Position for an Indigenous Student Developing Policy Materials September-December 2024

Are you:

- Energized by developing public health ideas based on the best available information?
- Excited by working on a variety of public health issues?
- Comfortable working remotely in an open, collaborative, team-based environment?

CPHA is looking for an Indigenous student to fill a paid and fully remote practicum position working on policy topics.

Candidates should be enrolled in a Masters of Public Health (MPH) or equivalent degree program in Canada. We will also consider fourth year students in a health science program that requires a practicum placement.

You'll help CPHA develop its policy-related positions and documents through a combination of independent and group-based activities that could include:

- Conducting literature reviews and analysis of public health topics of interest to the Association;
- Preparing draft versions of position papers, briefing notes and other related materials;
- Preparing blog postings for our web site; and
- Supporting the logistics and organizational needs of CPHA's policy-related activities.

To accomplish this work, you'll use and develop the following skills: literature searching; quantitative and qualitative data analysis; science and policy integration; and communications including writing for a general audience, social media and webpage content. Oral and written fluency in French is an asset, although the working language of the practicum is English.

Learning outcomes for you include:

- Experience working with a national, non-governmental, not-for-profit association;
- Knowledge of and contribution to the advancement of CPHA's vision and mission;
- Experience in implementing partnership, collaboration and advocacy strategies;
- Experience working on public health issues/initiatives with a variety of stakeholders;
- Experience in the preparation of briefings/reports in support of policy development and advocacy; and
- Knowledge of public health issues, social determinants of health and health promotion approaches.

Compensation: This position is a **paid practicum placement**, paying a living wage.

Period of Work: This fully remote practicum placement is available between **September-December 2024**, dependent upon program requirements and student availability. Incumbents may work full-time (7 hours/day; five days a week), though part-time work is possible provided the program requirements for the practicum placement are met.

Send your CV, a cover letter, and a letter of support from your academic supervisor to hr-rh@cpha.ca by **May 31, 2024**. Please also send with your application either an official document attesting to Indigenous identity (i.e. status, beneficiary/modern treaty, citizenship/membership card) or a statement explaining how you identify as First Nations, Inuit or Métis.

All applications will be reviewed, but only those candidates selected for an interview will be notified.
